### **GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT**

Prepared by Sarah Novo Economic Development Meeting of July 15, 2021

#### 1. **Public Services**

- Work on street projects continuing.
- · We are seeing an influx of quickly growing weeds and grasses citywide. Staff are in the process of prioritizing maintenance to city-owned property while also keeping up with the regular maintenance and special projects and tasks. This has been particularly challenging with very few staff on duty (the remainder have been out for medical and/or planned vacation.) There are also several large upcoming projects which will be time and staff consuming (to include: street repairs, a large electric upgrade and splash pad drainage). Staff are requesting patience as they work to prioritize and address requests as they are received.

#### 2. **Police**

- The Police Department has sponsored a cadet (Ty Roggenkamp) through an upcoming academy in order to fill a vacant patrol officer position. His official start date with the City was June 23, and he will be working in a non-commissioned status until graduation from the academy which is held July 29-Dec 10.
- Close patrol is continuing for traffic enforcement on 609, 90 and 95.

#### 3.

The volunteer fire department has continued to express that they are looking to recruit volunteers.

#### 4. **Parks**

- Sprayed for mosquitos 7/1
- Shredded the new park property
- Mowed around the splash pad for event on 7/2
- Splash pad grand opening and ribbon cutting on July 2<sup>nd</sup> was well attended. We estimate that over 100 people were in attendance. Special thanks to Fayette Savings Bank for their generous donation of food and drinks for all attendees and 50 pool passes for area children to enjoy a free visit to the pool.
- I received the following email last week from an out-of-town family visiting the pool: "Just wanted to comment on the excellent & friendly staff you have at the Flatonia pool. We are visiting family in the Schulenburg area from Minnesota and wanted to entertain the kids at the pool. Thanks for maintaining such a nice facility.

Keep up the great work 🔥"



- Our Pool team and the City utility crews are doing a great job this year. Many surrounding pools
  are not seeing the attendance we are getting. Staff have received a number of comments
  regarding friendly welcoming employees, attention to safety and cleanliness, and the welcoming
  and appealing presence of the City in general. If you see these employees, please share your
  thanks.
- Staff is in the process of identifying costs for wayfinding signage city-wide.

#### 5. Administration

- No City budget workshops are currently scheduled. Staff proposed the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> although those dates did not work for many. We will need to schedule workshops asap in order to stay on track with the budget calendar.
- No auditor RFQ's have been returned by deadline. Staff will re-publish.
- City Attorney RFQ's due Friday 7/9. Several have been received.
- The last update from the Audit team is that the audit will now be received in August.
- The rollout of online bill pay ran into very few issues. Overall, the feedback has been positive. The portal opened last week. We currently have 28 customers signed up to pay online.
- LCRA grant projects submissions are open July 1 and 20% matching funds are required for grants above 5k and up to 50k. Most successful requests are in the neighborhood of 25k.
   Potential projects include:
  - PD is in need of new handheld and vehicle radio systems. Quotes returned at almost \$50,000.
  - o Bridge at Mc Whirter Park. Staff are connecting with engineers to determine costs for engineering, construction and access.
  - o Covered shade area for splash pad.
- Staff are also looking into the status of Flatonia as a film friendly community.

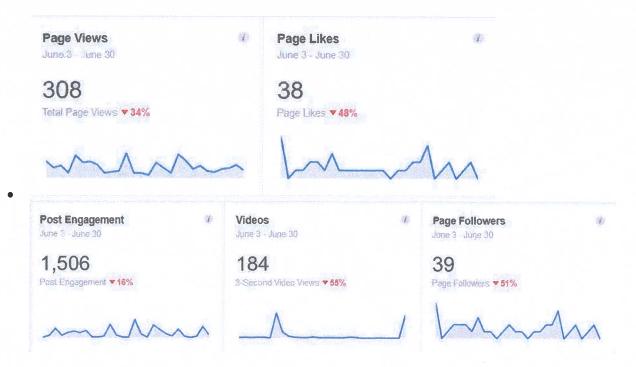

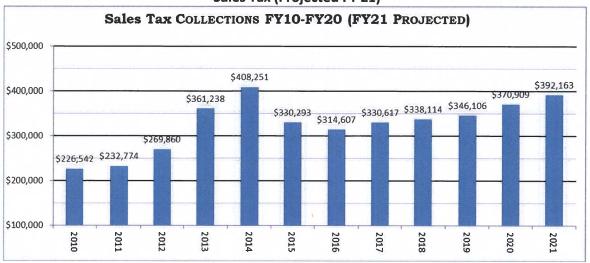

Consider and take appropriate action on a recommendation for the Flatonia Economic Development Corporation's Fiscal Year 2021/2022 budget to provide funding to partially cover administrative expenses of the City of Flatonia.

# Background:

At the April 15, 2021, Flatonia EDC meeting, it was discussed that the Economic Development Corporation might consider planning to contribute to the administrative costs associated with the City Manager and City Secretary's salaries in proportion to the time spent related to EDC responsibilities.

As an example, a 15% contribution of the City Manager's and City Secretary's salaries would be approximately \$23,000 (this amount does not include fringe benefits etc). Time spent related to the Flatonia EDC includes financial administration, project management, reporting, agenda and minute preparation, training, and other tasks.
